IF METHODISTS ASKED THEM, WHY NOT ME?

I'm told these are 22 questions the members of John Wesley's Holy Club asked themselves every day in their private devotions. If Methodists — who practice infant baptism and believe they can lose their salvation — ask these questions of themselves, how much more should Bible-believing Baptists be asking them??

- 1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?
- 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
- 3. Do I confidentially pass on to another what was told to me in confidence?
- 4. Can I be trusted?
- 5. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
- 6. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
- 7. Did the Bible live in me today?
- 8. Do I give the Bible time to speak to me every day?
- 9. Am I enjoying prayer?
- 10. When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?
- 11. Do I pray about the money I spend?
- 12. Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?
- 13. Do I disobey God in anything?
- 14. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
- 15. Am I defeated in any part of my life?
- 16. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy, or distrustful?
- 17. How do I spend my spare time?
- 18. Am I proud?
- 19. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican?
- 20. Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold resentment towards, or disregard? If so, what am I doing about it?
- 21. Do I grumble or complain constantly?
- 22. Is Christ real to me?

Much of today's preaching and teaching fails to exhort believers to examine themselves daily by the Word of God (2 Corinthians 13:5; James 1:22-25). As a result, many Christians are ignorant of the doctrines of biblical separation — instead patterning themselves after the watered-down Christianity of today (2 Timothy 4:3,4). Worldliness amongst independent Baptist has sadly become the norm: Brethren, these things ought not so to be. If our light is to shine brightly in these dark days, then there must be a continual trimming of OUR wick and polishing of OUR lamp. Let's get back to asking the hard questions of ... ourselves!
